- b. Identifies law enforcement codes and silent commands procedures/rights of arrest
- c. Recognizes principles of law enforcement observation, perception, retention and analysis
- d. Recognizes principles of court decisions regarding laws of arrest, search and seizure

7. CRIME VICTIMS/WITNESSES

- a. Knows how to provide/complete referrals, skill building and needs assessment

- c. Understands purpose of Victim/Witness program, Center for Family Solutions, Rape Crisis network, and Child Abuse Prevention
